






Message from the Editor


STUDENT LEADERS'

MARIE CURIE

Marie Curie was the first women to win a Nobel Prize in physics and with her next win in Chemistry she became the first person to claim the Nobel Honor twice. With her husband Pierre Curie, Marie's efforts led to the

discovery of polonium and radium and after Pierre's death, the further development of x-rays. Marie Sklodowska later known as Marie Curie, was born on November 7 1867 in Warsaw (Poland). Curie was the youngest of five children, Zofia, Józef, Bronya and Helena.

Both of Curie's parents were teachers. Her father Wladyslaw was a math and physics instructor. When she was only 10, Curie lost her mother, Bronislawa to tuberculosis. For roughly 5 years, Curie worked as a tutor and governess. She used her spare time to study physics, chemistry and math.

Curie died on July 4, 1924 of aplastic anemia believed to be caused by prolonged exposure to radiation.

From Seattle we flew to Alaska where we stayed in a cabin, visited a mountain with glacier fish and moose.



Empowering Children with ADHD: A Comprehensive Approach for Educators and Families:

We all are born different with special abilities, skill set and personalities. We all have different innate characters and traits which needs to be accepted the way we are.

Around 51% of children are categorized as experiencing "learning poverty" and are not proficient in reading. Despite technological and societal advancements, which suggest that Generation Z should lead the way for Generation Alpha, the literacy rates in some countries paint a different picture.

Another significant concern for today's children, particularly Generation Z, is Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), a neurodevelopmental disorder marked by inattention, hyperactivity, and impulsiveness. ADHD typically begins in childhood and can continue into adulthood. While the exact cause of it remains unclear, it is believed to result from a combination of genetic, environmental, psychological and neurological factors, with dietary elements also playing a role.

- Environmental Factors: Modern lifestyle factors, such as increased screen time, less physical activity, and dietary changes, might contribute to the manifestation of ADHD symptoms.
- Prenatal Exposure: Smoking, alcohol, and drug use during pregnancy increase the risk of ADHD.
- Stress: High levels of Family stress can worsen ADHD symptoms.
- Dietary Factors:
- -Sugar and Additives: High consumption of sugar and food additives.
- -Nutritional Deficiencies: Lack of essential fatty acids, zinc, iron, and magnesium can contribute to ADHD symptoms.

How can educators and family help kids with ADHD -



INTERVENTION FOR EDUCATORS:

- As educators, make the child sit next to the teacher, encourage the child to participate in classroom activities by giving them small responsibilities, e.g., erasing the board, distribution of books, helping the teacher, etc.
- Motivate and appreciate the child by giving rewards, certificates and stars.
- Give them a small paragraph or line to be told aloud in the class before hand so that the parents can prepare the child beforehand rather than give a surprise reading or surprise test.
- Break the task in steps so that it's easier for the child to follow the commands.
- If a child finishes the task early then encourage them to help his friends and other students in the class.
- We as educators should provide maximum understanding and emotional support to the child
- Giving Individualized Instruction- Tailoring teaching methods and using assistive technology can be beneficial.

INTERVENTIONS FOR PARENTS:

- Learning Parent management techniques with home plans
- Encourage outdoor play.
- Behaviour therapy using positive reinforcement for target based behaviour techniques such as routines and reward systems.
- Formal assessment for IQ and Learning Disablity.
- Social skills training.
- Healthy Lifestyle- A balanced diet, regular physical activity, and adequate sleep help manage symptoms.
- Collaborative Approach: Cooperation with teachers, healthcare providers, and therapists creates a cohesive support system.

Effective ADHD management requires a comprehensive approach involving environmental adjustments, dietary considerations, and consistent support from both educators and family members. Addressing these factors can significantly mitigate the impact of ADHD on children's lives.
